

Higher Level Skills Funding: Now Available!



Funding available for ACM40412 Certificate IV in Veterinary Nursing

The Higher Level Skills program is a Queensland Government initiative, providing students the opportunity to gain funding towards their qualification.

Hurry, current funding offer only guaranteed until 30th June 2019!!

The aim is to assist Queenslanders in securing employment, career advancement or transition to university.

Students can only receive access to the Higher Level Skills program subsidy once, so before you enrol, make sure you have considered your options before committing to this course.

Eligibility

To be eligible to receive funding under the Higher Level Skills program, you must be:

- a Queensland resident
- over 15 years of age
- an Australian citizen, or a New Zealand citizen, or an Australian permanent resident, or a temporary resident with the necessary visa and work permits on the pathway to permanent residency
- not be enrolled in or have completed a Certificate IV or higher level qualification. This excludes qualifications completed while at school and foundations skills training.

Entry requirements

To enrol in Certificate IV in Veterinary Nursing, students are required to be working as a veterinary nurse for a minimum of 15 hours per week in paid employment. Employment must be maintained for the duration of the course. If the student changes workplaces, a "Change of Enrolment Status" form is available online, on the course website.

Program cost

While the program is subsidised, the student is still required to pay a co-contribution fee. This fee can be paid by the student, their employer, or a third party.
